SPEAKER PROFILES

Richard Wilmot-Smith Q.C., 39 Essex St Chambers, London

Richard Wilmot-Smith Q.C. has been practicing as a barrister in the field of construction and engineering and arbitration for thirty four years and has been a QC for nineteen years. He has acted as counsel in many domestic and international arbitrations both ad hoc and under rules. He has also served as joint arbitrator, sole arbitrator and chairman in international arbitrations under rules, particularly ICC, LCIA and DIAC. As arbitrator his arbitrations have involved involve food franchises, energy projects, telecommunications, intellectual property disputes, agency agreements, PFI projects and construction and engineering. He was author and now editor of the OUP publication Construction Contracts, Law and Practice; first edition 2006, third edition due March 2014. He was joint head and then head of 39 Essex Street Chambers 2003-2011.

Susan Macnaughton, Practice Leader of the firm's mediation practice, Gall HK

Susan is the practice leader of the firm's mediation practice. She is an accredited mediator and solicitor. She has had nearly 20 years experience resolving legal disputes in Hong Kong, having been a litigation partner in City firms. Prior to joining the HKIAC, Ruth worked with several international law firms in London, Sydney and Paris advising on a wide range of proceedings including international commercial arbitrations conducted under the ICC, LCIA, UNCITRAL, ICDR, VIAC and WIPO rules of arbitration as well as associated national court proceedings in civil and common law jurisdictions. She also provided advice regarding the formulation and drafting of arbitration and dispute resolution clauses in commercial contracts, including multi-party and multi-contract situations. Ruth graduated from the University of Sydney with a Bachelor of Economics (Social Science) in 2001 and a Bachelor of Laws (First Class Hons) in 2005. She was admitted as solicitor of the Supreme Court of New South of Wales and High Court of Australia in 2006 and in England and Wales in 2010.

Christopher To is the Executive Director Construction Industry Council, a statutory body in Hong Kong tasked among other functions to advise and make recommendations to the Government on strategic matters, major policies and legislative proposals, that may affect or are

connected with the construction industry, and on matters of concern to the construction industry. As former Secretary-General of the Hong Kong International Arbitration Centre, he managed to elevate Hong Kong's status as the regional dispute resolution hub of Asia by increasing the number of international dispute cases being referred to Hong Kong for amiable resolution as well as creating the Asian Domain Name Dispute Resolution Centre, a body that has gain international prominence within the dot.com community as a reliable, trustworthy, independent and reputable entity that manages domain name disputes. In recognition of his outstanding leadership and his contribution to the community, in 2001 he was honored as the youngest Director of the Year in Hong Kong and in 2007 he was honored as a Young Global Leader by the World Economic Forum. Christopher holds qualifications in computing, engineering and law. He is a recognized authority on alternative dispute resolution techniques and is a sought-after speaker/moderator at international forums. He holds Adjunct Professorships from leading Universities and is on the board of various organisations ranging from education to research and development.

She has been a research fellow in Arbitration Research Institute of CCOIC since 2004 after she got her doctoral degree of legal science (SJD) from Hong Kong University. She was appointed the director of the Arbitration Research Institute of CCOIC in 2005. She was in charge of the drafting work of CIETAC Arbitration Rules (2005 and 2012) and CIETAC's Articles of Association. Dr. Wang is on the Panel of Arbitrators of CIETAC. She has also served as Chair, sole arbitrator, or as a member of international and domestic arbitration panels. She has also been appointed as an expert dealing with domain name dispute cases by CIETAC Domain Name Dispute Resolution Center. Dr. Wang was the chief editor of Arbitration and Law, a famous Chinese journal on arbitration with history of more than 20 years. She is the chair of the Case Edition Committee of CIETAC, which is in charge of compiling and editing the CIETAC's arbitral awards and publishing yearbooks.
