WEBINAR - DOCUMENTS ONLY ARBITRATION

19 May 2022

Since the Covid-19 pandemic and the various lockdowns imposed, there has been much talk of virtual hearings which has very quickly become the 'new norm'. Particularly in construction disputes where projects are usually well documented, parties have even been eager to explore the option of dispensing with formal hearings entirely allowing proceedings to be conducted solely based on documentary submissions.

On 19 May 2022, The Malaysian Institute of Arbitrators hosted a Webinar titled 'Documents only Arbitration' to discuss the matter further.

Speaking on the topic were Mr. Rajendra Navaratnam, Senior Partner of Azman Davidson & Co as well as Ms. Tan Swee Im, Chartered Arbitrator at 39 Essex Chambers. The session was moderated by Mr. Allen Cheng, then Council Member and present Secretary of The Malaysian Institute of Arbitrators.



The speakers discussed the advantages and disadvantages of a Documents only Arbitration as well as the right to an oral hearing. Attendees were also brought up to date on the latest developments in relation to the Construction Industry Payment and Adjudication Act (CIPAA).



**ADR IN A KALEIDOSCOPE
BEYOND WHAT MEETS THE EYE**

When Elon Jaffe sang "the viewing kaleidoscope moves us all in turn", there is perhaps little chance he was thinking about commerce and dispute resolution. Yet the metaphor is surely apt. The kaleidoscope takes us all back to our past a try to transform the ordinary mechanical in a special of vibrant and vivid patterns. These spots, the coloured pieces are themselves of little value, but when put together, a single twist creates infinite and constantly transforming patterns. It is a tool which translates the occupation of the hand to pleasure of the eye.

The changes in ADR are as all-time-point in the changing scenes in a kaleidoscope. Throughout its evolution, the subject has its own renewed commercial tenets of efficiency and cost as the primary drivers. However, the future will require a perspective that understands how the other colours pieces are overlooked: the social, political and economic interplay with the commercial for more meaningful and more-challenging patterns. Although the patterns will have the same pieces over and over again, it becomes critical therefore to look at the arrangement of the pieces themselves and how they can be placed and rotated to engrain a vision that is acceptable.

ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION FOR CONSTRUCTION IN INDONESIA: GROWTH, CHALLENGES, AND OPPORTUNITIES

Over the years, Indonesia has shown exponential growth in its construction industry. Despite disruptions and risks owing to the current pandemic, the industry shows no sign of stopping as it continues to develop. It is inevitable, however, that disputes will arise from and in relation to construction contracts. In this session, the Panel will introduce and consider the typical types of disputes arising from the construction industry, as well as discuss recent developments on alternative dispute resolution practices in resolving such disputes in Indonesia.
